



### Comparing how many take more than one of 1xx and 3xx, during 2006W & 2007W.

Most students take eoscl1x in 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> year. Most students take eoscl31x in 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> yr. Therefore there really should be a full 4-5 years involved in this comparison rather than the present two years of data.

**Comments:**

First year courses may be taken without EOSC 111, but EOSC 111 *cannot* be taken without one of EOSC 110, 112, 114 or 116.

The fact that 115 students take both eoscl14 and eoscl16 is interesting given that both of these are rather 'soft' courses.

NOT investigated: which two courses are EOS majors taking. This will be part of the "quick survey" we ask all EOS students to complete.

Between 15% and 20% of students in each class taking two others seems like a lot, especially given these numbers include only two consecutive years.

180 students taking eoscl14 plus two other courses (within only 2 years) is perhaps the most "alarming" number from this figure.
